

2011 Heritage Ornament Features the Holy Family Hospital



The Holy Family Hospital is the focus of this year's Heritage Ornament celebrating the 100th anniversary of this historic site. Heritage Ornaments are available at all the banks in the city and the Chamber of Commerce Office. The cost is just 15 dollars and the proceeds will be donated to the Victoria Hospital Foundation.

Construction on the original Holy Family Hospital started in April of 1910, and it was opened in December of 1910. The first patient was admitted Christmas Day with quinsy. Additions were made in 1915 and 1934. The Nursing School was added in 1920. The School of Nursing was closed in 1969, a total of 710 nurses graduated from HFSN.

The new Holy Family Hospital was officially opened December 18th, 1963. Architects were: Weber, Forrester, Scott and Associates of Saskatoon. The contractors were: Smith Brothers and Wilson of Saskatoon.

The Heritage Ornament series was launched in 2000 and features a different historically significant building in Prince Albert each year. Many people collect the complete series.
